COVID-19 Response: Federal Public Sector Supports

Canada Emergency Response Benefit (CERB)

- Direct financial support of \$2,000 per month per worker, for up to four months;
- Replaces two previously announced programs;
- Targets workers facing a loss of income lost job, sick, quarantined, taking care of sick or stay home to care of children; and
- Applications delivered online (Service Canada and CRA) with payments to be made every four weeks from March 15 to October 3, 2020.



Canada Emergency Business Account

- Interest-free loan to small businesses and not-for-profits of up to \$40,000 to cover operating costs where revenues have been temporarily reduced;
- Business will receive up to \$10,000 in loan forgiveness when load repaid by December 31, 2022
- Eligible businesses have a total payroll of between \$50,000 to \$1 million in 2019;
- Applications are delivered through the organizations financial institution and will be available April 9th.



Canada Emergency Wage Subsidy

- 75% wage subsidy for each employee for up to three months; to a maximum of \$847 per week on salaries of up to \$58,700 and is designed to protect jobs and maintain the important link between employees and employers.
- For eligible businesses, charitable or not-for-profit organizations that have experienced a 15% decline in revenue in March 2020 and a 30% decline in revenue during April and May.
- Government is now providing some flexibility in calculating revenue decrease, including different comparison months and organizations use of cash or accrual accounting; and
- Applications are backdated to March 15th and delivered through CRA, beginning April 9th.



Additional Measures for Workers and Individuals

- Canada Child Benefit additional \$300 per child;
- Goods and Services Tax Credit one time payment for low and modest-income earners of \$400 for individuals and \$600 for families; and
- Income Tax filing deadline deferral until June 1st and deferral of tax owing until August 31st.



Additional Measures for Businesses

- Business Credit Availability Program (BCAP) \$40 Billion in liquidity for businesses through BDC and EDC;
- Work Sharing program term doubled from 38 to 76 weeks;
- Income Tax deferral of tax owing until August 31st; and
- GST/HST and Customs Duty payments deferral until June 30th.



Chamber Network Tools

Canadian Business Resilience Network (CBRN)

- Campaign to help the business community prepare, persevere and ultimately prosper as we collectively face the pandemic.
- Campaign elements include:
 - CBRN.ca website to provide insights, best practices and tools for business;
 - Information sharing and awareness building initiatives through a daily newsletter, weekly teleconferences; and a webinar series; and
 - **Digital toolkits** that chambers, businesses and associations can use to help them manage through the crisis and prepare for recovery.



Chamber Network Tools (continued)

Statistics Canada Partnership

- Canadian Survey of Business Conditions capture insights from Canadian businesses;
- One of the largest crowdsourced business intelligence surveys in Canadian history; and
- Critical to informing government decision making during this challenging time.
